PART 1

Identify the Current Issue

The kingdom way of life is radical. Jesus' teaching contradicts the conventional wisdom we've been taught all of our lives. For instance, our Lord said, "He who saves his life will lose it. But he who loses his life for my sake shall find it." Jesus said, "You've heard it said that you should hate your enemies, but I tell you, love your enemies. Pray for those who persecute you." He said, "If you want to be great in the kingdom, become the servant of all." In the Beatitudes, Jesus said, "Blessed are the poor in spirit, blessed are those who mourn, blessed are the meek." Jesus was showing us that the root of our misery is that we live such self-centered lives. We need to be delivered from ourselves.

Discover the Eternal Principles

Teaching point one: Jesus commanded us to desire righteousness.

Teaching point two: Our actions show if we desire God's righteousness.

PART 3

Apply Your Findings
